4. Select as many publications as you would like from the pop-up window and click “Add Alerts.”

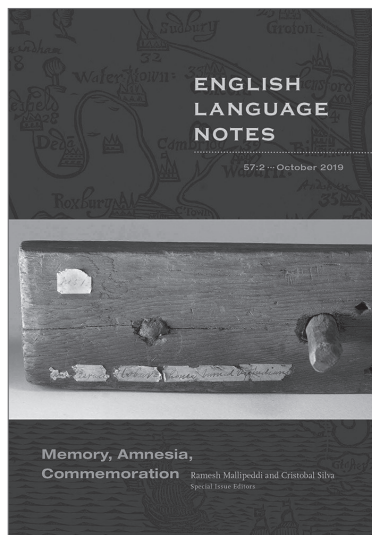

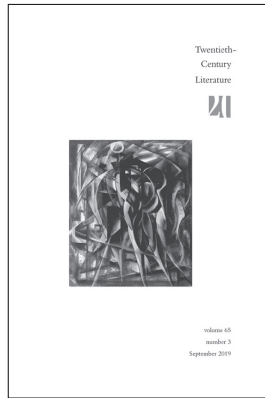
