Table A1 Prospective Descriptions of Desires/Plans for Future Pregnancies

<p><i>Stopping/Long Delay</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Yeah, he (partner) wants another child. I'm not going to have any more kids any time soon. (not pregnant) 2. If I decide to get off (injectable contraception), I'll be getting my tubes tied. Because I know I'm not having any more (children). (not pregnant) 3. Respondent: I don't want children. Interviewer: Just right now? Respondent: I don't want children, period. (not pregnant) 4. If I could really get my tubes tied (at upcoming delivery), I would request for them to get tied.
