CHARLES WAGLEY

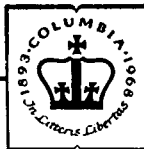

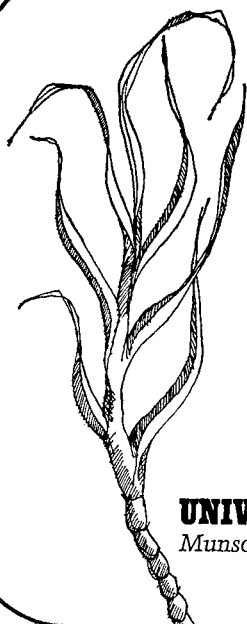
