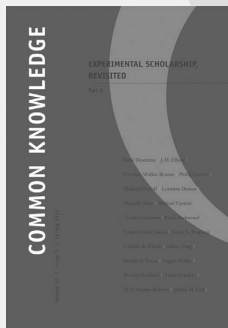


COMMON KNOWLEDGE

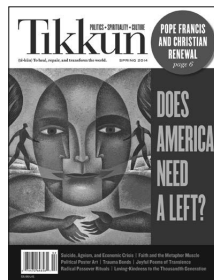
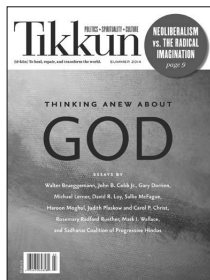
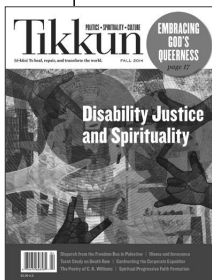
