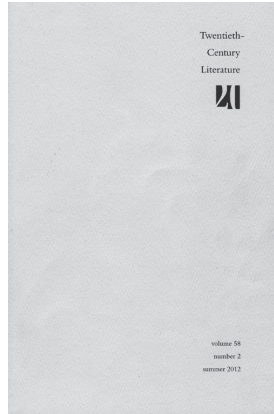




Twentieth-Century Literature

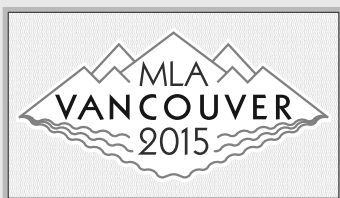

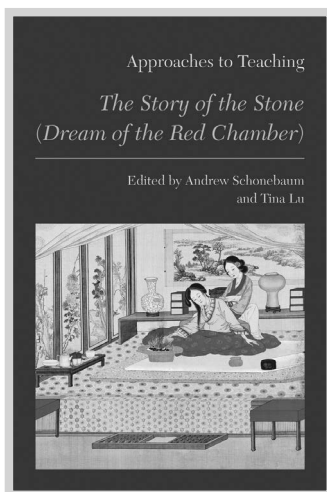

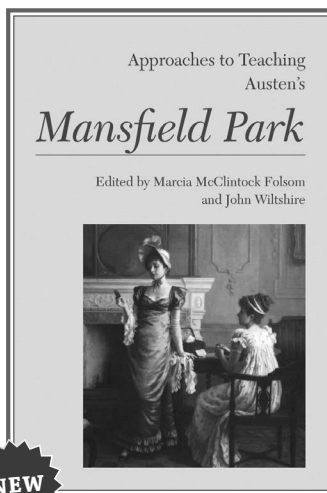

Essays discuss various aspects of
the novel, including the slave trade,
the theme of reading, elements
of tragedy, gift theory, landscape
design, moral improvement in the
spirit of Samuel Johnson and of the
Reformation, sibling relations, card
playing, and interpretations of Fanny
Price, the heroine, not as passive but
as having some control.

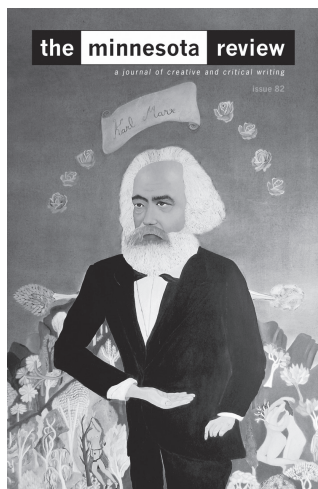
