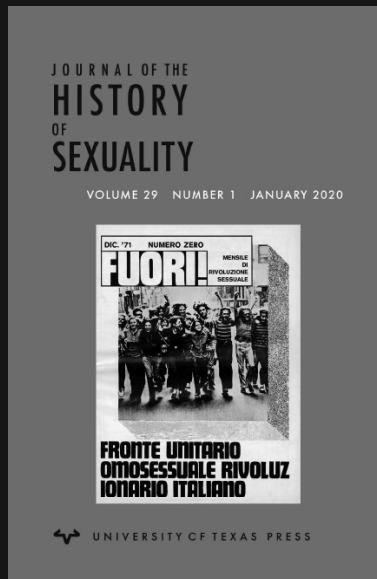


JOURNAL OF THE HISTORY OF SEXUALITY
